



ENCOURAGE: Toby's Story







Toby was only 4 years old when he was diagnosed with Stage 4 Brain Cancer, Medulloblastoma with Spinal Metastasis in March 2017. Devastated and unprepared, his parents made a difficult decision to put their little boy through a major brain surgery to remove the tumour in his cerebellum. They could not do much but to wait anxiously as they hoped for the best.

While they were relieved that Toby survived the surgery, they were saddened to note that their once vivacious boy had developed Posterior Fossa Syndrome and Cerebral Mutism Syndrome from his surgery. He was unable to talk, walk, eat, or swallow and his eyes did not seem to register anything.

Soon after the surgery and through 2018, Toby had to undergo 4 rounds of chemotherapy in tandem with stem cell transplants, 33 rounds of radiotherapy while under general anaesthesia, and 2 more brain surgeries and procedures. As a result of the chemotherapy, Toby developed a permanent moderate hearing loss in his right ear, and a severe loss in his left ear.

He also contracted pneumonia and meningitis due to his weakened immune system. It was a tough period for the family while they struggled with Toby's condition and caring for the 2 older boys at home.



Toby's mother stayed by his side throughout the 8 months stay in KK Women & Children Hospital (KKH). Fighting on hard, Toby overcame his illnesses and proceeded with a tandem stem cell transplant

Friends and families came around to provide their help & support, as Toby's parents psychologically braced themselves for a tough journey ahead to get Toby back to his usual self. In addition, Toby's parents found **Brain Tumour Society** Singapore (Limited) and connected with parent caregivers in similar situations that provided them with solace and encouragement through peer support and shared information



IT'S TOBY'S PLAY TIME!!










At the beginning of 2019, Toby's parents were amazed and encouraged when Toby showed signs of learning to walk again.

By Toby's 8th birthday, he was ABLE to walk very fast and enjoy himself at the playground. While his parents were so glad about the progress in his recovery, they knew he still had a long way to go to in recovering his speech to relate normally with the rest of his family and integrate back to society.

Despite all the hardship that Toby and his family has endured, they continue to remain positive with the zeal and perseverance to carry on.







A seizure is a sudden surge of electrical activity in the brain. A seizure usually affects how a person appears or acts for a short time. It can cause a person to have abnormal jerking movements in one or more limbs or in the face. It can also cause one to lose consciousness and fall to the ground....

HOW ARE SEIZURES RELATED TO BRAIN TUMORS?

Seizures can be associated with Brain Tumours and may represent the first clinical sign of a brain tumour. Both malignant and benign (non-cancerous) brain tumours can cause seizures or other neurologic problems, such as paralysis and speech difficulties... Read more



WHAT ARE THE DIFFERENT TYPES OF SEIZURES?



Seizures can be focal (affecting one part of the body) or generalised (affecting multiple areas). They can be partial (no loss of consciousness) or complex (associated with loss of consciousness) Some other characteristics of seizures include the following:

- Tonic: Muscles in the body become stiff.
- Atonic: Muscles in the body relax completely and causes one to fall to the ground.
- Myoclonic: Short jerking in parts of the body.
- Clonus: Periods of shaking or jerking parts on the body

WHY DOES A BRAIN TUMOUR CAUSE SEIZURES?

Brain tumours result in an abnormal growth of cells and may cause swelling and irritation to surrounding brain cells. This affects the normal electrical activity in the brain which triggers a seizure...... Read more



FACTORS THAT CAN TRIGGER AND INCREASE FREQUENCY OF SEIZURES



- -Fatigue and Sleep Deprivation
- Stress and anxiety
- ·Flashing Light Patterns
- ·Low Blood Sugar
